THE CLIFFORD MUSTER ROLL OF 1510-11

The tenth Lord Clifford had a muster prepared which became known as the Flodden Roll. The criteria for enlistment are unknown but this roll had able men of Rimington listed because Lord Clifford's son-in-law, Henry Pudsay, was Lord of the Manor of Rimington at the time. The roll has two sections which would explain the two spellings of Rimington in it. The first listed those who could handle a horse and a weapon, and the second listed those "able in person but not in harness."
